Q: What does ACES mean?

A: The Atlantic Canada Electronics Stewardship (ACES) Program is an industry-led electronics recycling program approved by the province of Nova Scotia which is available to all consumers and businesses in the province.

Q: Why do I have to recycle my unwanted electronics?

A: As of February 1st 2009, many more electronic products were banned from landfill disposal in Nova Scotia. These products must be recycled under the ACES Program. Electronics contain many toxic chemicals and keeping these materials out of the landfill helps to protect our environment.
