

How to dispose...?

Car Parts



Car parts **SHOULD** be taken to your local scrap metal dealer or an auto recycler for proper disposal.

Small Household Appliances



Small household appliances SHOULD be placed in your clear bags for GARBAGE.

Printer Toner Cartridge



Contact manufacturer on how to properly dispose of printer toner cartridges.

Please note: Toner cartridges MUST NOT be placed in your recycling bags.

Lab/Medical Waste (No Needles/Sharps)



Items found in the home for medical care SHOULD be placed in the GARBAGE.

Please note: Needles/Sharps MUST be placed in a Safe Sharps container and returned to your pharmacy.

Lithium Ion Batteries

Illegal Dumping is against the LAW!



Illegal Dumping is the dumping of waste in the woods, on someone else's property or using someone's dumpster without permission.

Under the "Municipal Solid Waste Bylaw" an offender could face a fine of up to \$5000.

Construction & Demolition Waste



Asphalt Shingles

\$35 per metric tonne
(Asphalt shingles are ground into flakes for energy and traction sand).



Clean, Unpainted Drywall

\$35 per metric tonne (Clean, unpainted drywall is added to

compost. Drywall is high in calcium which is good for your soil).



Clean Wood

\$35 per metric tonne (Wood is grounded up & marketed as an energy source).



Scrap Metal

\$35 per metric tonne

(Scrap metal is baled onsite & sold to be made into new material).

Disposing of these materials in dedicated loads will save you money!

Provincial Recycling

Plastic Bag Ban



October 30, 2020, businesses are not allowed to hand out single-use plastic bags at checkouts. Remember to bring your own reusable bags.

Tire Recycling



You can return up to four tires 24.5 inches or less to any retailer in the province, free of charge. They must be off the rim and free of mud and debris. Leave used tires at the retailer when you buy new ones. For more information on tire recycling visit divertns.ca/used-passenger-tires

Safe Sharps Bring Back Program



Under this program, residents who generate sharps in their home can pick up a plastic 3 litre or 5 litre container at their local pharmacy. When the container is full, it can be returned to the pharmacy for disposal. For more information visit pans.ns.ca/public/programs/safe-sharps

Used Oil



There are municipalities and local garages who will accept small quanities of used oil, used filters and antifreeze. There is no fee for this service.

Recycle My Cell

Colchester County Enviro-Depots

Return beverage containers to your local ENVIRO-DEPOTS for a refund.

Enviro-Depots also accept leftover household paint (tightly sealed in its original container with the lid and label still readable).

NOTE: Milk cartons are NOT accepted at Enviro-Depots

These should be placed in your blue bag with containers recyclables and placed curbside for collection.

Compost is available for bulk sale from our facility throughout the entire year! The cost is \$35.00 per metric tonne. You are allowed to come out with your truck and trailer to purchase bulk compost.

Christmas Wrapping Paper



This is due to the large amount of dye within the paper & the contaminants that accompany it (tape, bows, ribbons etc.).

> Wrapping paper should always be placed in your clear bag for garbage disposal.



To reduce waste you can use recycled wrapping paper or newspaper. You can make it look more festive by adding a sprig of evergreen or drawing on the paper.

The brown wrapping paper can go in your blue bag for paper or even your green cart for compost.
