Quarterly Update on Strategic Priorities 2020-24

March 2022



Overview of the Municipality

The Municipality of Colchester is a community of communities stretching over the agricultural heartland of Nova Scotia, from the Northumberland Straight, to the Minas Basin, to the border of HRM, making it the 4th largest county in Nova Scotia and home to a variety of employment, educational, social, and housing opportunities.

The Municipality of Colchester is home to approximately 38,000 people and growing in terms of numbers and diversity of our residents.

While we cherish and protect our rich history, Colchester is also a modern municipality focused on the ever-evolving needs of our communities. Colchester delivers services, solely or in collaboration with community and government partners, in five distinct areas of a sustainable community:

1. Environment and safety

Maintaining a healthy and natural environment through responsible use, protection, and sustainable practices.

2. Infrastructure

Well maintained infrastructure and facilities that meet community needs and allow growth and development for prosperity.

3. Economy

Building a strong and vibrant community by attracting, supporting, and retaining businesses and residents.

4. Social

Building social capital and engaging citizens and partners to improve the well-being and diversity of the community.

5. Governance

Being fiscally sustainable.



Overview of Strategic Priorities

Our strategic priorities document provides an overarching framework to communicate to the public, staff, community stakeholders, and government partners, a path by which we will achieve our commitments to creating a municipality that embraces innovation, good governance, and fiscal responsibility.

Identifying priorities allows Council and staff to make informed policy, operational and budget decisions, and provides a structure to ensure oversight and management of County initiatives and services.

Reporting regularly on progress related to our priorities allows us to assess how we are doing and what adjustments may be needed.

Our strategic priorities were developed through an engagement process with Council and consisted of:

- A strategic scan
- Brainstorming issues and opportunities
- Shortlisting priorities
- Exploring desired outcomes and response options
- Developing an action plan
- Committing to regular updates

The strategic priorities were further developed with input and guidance from municipal management from all departments. The result was the Municipality of Colchester Strategic Priorities 2020-24.


With this plan, Colchester will be able to make progress on its strategic goals and objectives as well as work to improve the core services we provide. The plan is intended to provide further direction to all staff and Council and is also intended to be a resource for the





Priorities and Focus Areas

- This document reports on Council's 5 strategic priroties, as well as 31 administrative and operational focus areas, for a total of 36.
- Of the 36, 78% are either completed or on track to be completed by their original time frame.



Strategic Priorities

As identified on page 8 of the strategic priorities document, these are the 5 priorities that Council identified as needing immediate attention based on organizational importance, community benefit, urgency of time, and the ability to act on the initiative in the short-term.

1. Police Review (on target)

While initial discussions began in earnest with the Department of Justice (DOJ) in 2019 with respect to undertaking a policing review; inclusive of completing a GDPRM, in 2020, an external consultant with expertise in policing (Mr. Bill Moore) was hired to serve as a technical advisor to Council. After undertaking a scan of the existing policing model utilized in the Municipality and having interviewed senior police and administrative leaders throughout the region/province, a survey was undertaken to verify Council's policing priorities. The report findings were subsequently presented to Council for consideration, including a ranking of components relative to Council's view of an ideal policing model. A subsequent meeting was held between municipal senior staff and the command staff of the Northeast Nova RCMP detachment to advise them on Council's stated priorities as it relates to policing, and to discuss the main findings of the consultant's report. It was agreed that RCMP Command Staff would be invited to a future municipal Council meeting to present and discuss options for RCMP policing moving forward, with the acknowledgment that Council may wish to undertake an RFP process should they wish to do so. Currently, RCMP Command Staff are scheduled to present to Council in mid-May.

2. Debert Business Park Development Plan (on target)

The Debert Business Park Advisory Committee (DBPAC) has been presented with an asset inventory of Debert Business Park and opportunities for growth and development have been discussed. The next steps for staff and the committee are to organize and conduct planning sessions to develop a strategic framework for the park. This will be followed by the creation of an RFP and subsequent engagement of a consultant(s) to assist the DBPAC in developing a 10-year plan. Timeline to have a consultant engaged and working on DBP planning, July 2022. Estimated timeline for completion of a plan, December 2022.

3. Debert Airport Strategy (on target)

Council was provided updates on the Debert Airport and Debert Aviation Centre in both September 2021 and March 2022. These updates included a history and timelines of the Debert Business Park, airport and the aviation centre; an overview of current airport operations including information on the Truro Flying Club management agreement, aircraft traffic, annual revenues and expenses, and potential business opportunities both within the airport and the aviation centre; as well as proposed infrastructure improvements to bring the airport up to industry operational standards. In March, Council requested that staff develop a business plan to present to Council, including an option to explore selling the airport; timeline June 2022.

4. Debert Housing Prospectus (on target)

The Debert housing prospectus in on target. Since the strategic priorities' session with Council, an RFP was issued for the development of schematic design options for housing on the chosen property in Debert, and a contract was awarded to Fathom Studios. The consultants worked with the Debert Business Park Advisory Committee and a draft report was presented to the committee in February outlining three options. An online public engagement session to present the options was held online with about 10 people participating. Outcomes on the concept were positively received by those attending. The consultants will finalize the report in March. Next steps include examining servicing requirements for a proposed development, investigating private / public development partnerships and confirming a preferred project delivery approach; timeline May 2022.

5. J Class Roads and Roads Assessment (delayed)

This initiative is delayed. Various options for additional investment by the Municipality have been presented to council in previous months and years, all of which were not adopted. The Province is currently undertaking a review of its Municipal Service Exchange Agreement, which was last updated in 1995. In September, the Minister of Municipal Affairs stated he expects the review to take a year or longer. New funding formulas for J Class Roads, as part of an overall new service exchange agreement, may be included. In February, Council agreed to add J Class Roads to the upcoming operating budget deliberations.

Administrative and operational focus areas

The additional focus areas contained in the Strategic Priorities 2020-24 document dashboard (page 8) are arranged in the following pages according to departmental responsibility. Each focus area is listed and provided a short update, next steps, and estimated timeline for completion.

Administration

The Administration Department, under the CAO model of governance, is responsible for the day-today operations of the Municipality, ensuring the implementation and delivery of programs and services that are approved by Council. In addition to this, the Administration Department is responsible for:

- Economic development, including the Debert **Business Park**
- Research, policy, and community engagement
- Emergency management
- Corporate planning and strategic initiatives


